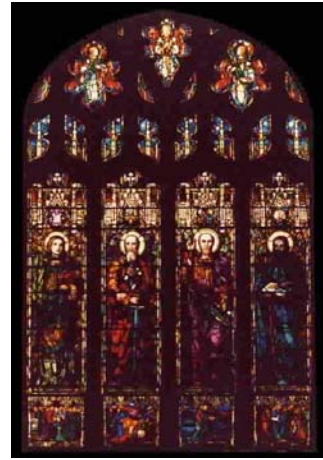

## From the Archives

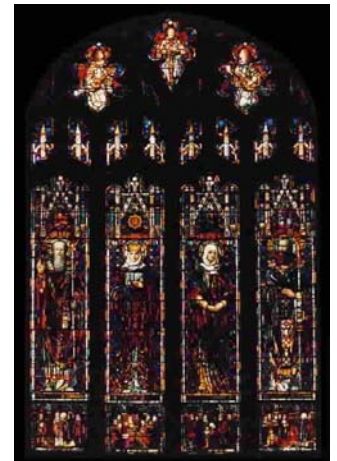
In the November issue of *Saints Alive*, this column dealt with the general background of All Saints' stained glass windows and their designer, Charles J. Connick. For the next several installments of "From the Archives", I will focus on each of the Connick windows individually, and the background of the individual donors.

The first of Connick's windows was the George H. Champlin Memorial Window. It is the window nearest and to the right of the doorway leading from the church to the Parish Center. This window is devoted to the four great early followers of Christ: Saint Stephen, Deacon and Protomartyr; Saint Paul; Saint Peter; and Saint James. This window, which was dedicated on April 17, 1910, was funded by a donation from George Champlin's wife, Julia. The window's memorial inscription reads: *In loving memory of George Hobron Champlin, Benefactor of this church. Born 1840 – Died 1907.*



This window was constructed in Arthur Cutter's workshop, which was located on Columbus Avenue in Boston. Connick, a virtual unknown at the time, did not as of yet have his own studio on Harcourt Street. In fact, it was this particular window that launched Connick's career as a stained glass artist. It was also Connick's good fortune that as a result of this piece, he came into contact with All Saints' architect Ralph Adams Cram, who was impressed by Connick's work. The two artists would go on to collaborate on many occasions.

In her will, Julia M. Champlin (1839-1910) left money for the construction of a second stained glass window for All Saints that would bear her own name. Similar to the first window, this one also features four figures: two Fathers of the Greek Church, Saint Polycarp and Saint Irenaeus; and two Virgin Martyrs, Saint Catherine of Alexandria and Saint Perpetua of Carthage. The Julia M. Champlin window, which was created at the Horace J. Phipps studio on Bedford Street, Boston, was dedicated on June 2, 1910, less than two months after the one dedicated to her husband. It is located to the right of the George H Champlin window. While we know quite a bit about the Champlin windows, what can be said of the Champlins themselves? Up until 1910, the Champlins were the greatest benefactors in the short history of All Saints, as it was their bequest that paid off the original \$50,000 mortgage on the church. In a brief history of All Saints, Dr. Addison, the parish's first rector, describes the Champlins and their contributions to the church:

"Among the benefactors of this parish, none stand higher than Mr. and Mrs. George H. Champlin. They were simple people who late in life found an abiding joy in the church, and by gifts and loans were of great value to the parish. When Mrs. Champlin was stricken with a mortal disease, and had to have a major operation, she sent for her lawyer and added a codicil to her will, bequeathing \$30,000 for a rectory, an act of serious thoughtfulness in a sad hour. The rectory was completed and occupied in 1913."

While there is little information about the life of Julia Champlin, some details about her husband's biography can be found in an obituary which appeared in the *Brookline Chronicle* on October 7, 1910. Born in Colchester, Conn. on October 5, 1840, Champlin came to Boston at an early age. He was at one time the proprietor of the old Marlborough Hotel. Sometime around 1880, Champlin founded the piano firm of George H. Champlin & Co., which was located at 181 Tremont St., Boston. Apparently Champlin had a great fondness for horses and was said to have owned some of Boston's fastest. He died at his home at 729 Washington St. in Brookline on Sunday morning, October 6, 1907. The Champlins had moved to Brookline sometime around 1895, during the same time that All Saints was being established. Their names appear in a listing of unanimously elected members of the Parish Corporation from February 21, 1895. For All Saints, the Champlins' move to Brookline was indeed a fortunate one, for it resulted in the gifts of two beautiful stained glass windows, a parish rectory, and financial security for many years to come.

## Interview with Becky Taylor, Director of Children's, Youth and Family Ministries at All Saints Parish

A noisy Starbucks in Washington Square is not where I would expect to find a better understanding about spirituality and balance for families. In a conversation, however, with Becky Taylor, the new All Saints Director of Children's, Youth, and Family Ministries, I did find it, alongside my size venti house blend coffee, five packets of sugar, and extra half and half.

As an Episcopalian and preacher's kid, Becky's connection to the church goes as far back as she can remember, from riding her bike around the church parking lot to attending Sunday services. Church was a natural extension of her family's home and a place to find best friends and neighbors.

As a new mother years later, Becky's connection to her church in Wellesley, Saint Andrew's, grew through nurturing her son's Christian education. Beginning by teaching Sunday School, her involvement at the parish expanded. She began to sense a call to lay ministry and was accepted at Andover Newton Theological School. Whether predestination or luck, Becky's field training was at All Saints, Brookline. Throughout her studies, volunteer work, and parish ministry, Becky has continued to feel that her calling is not to the altar, but to fostering connections among people of all ages as they gather in small groups to speak about God.

After five fulfilling years at The Parish of the Epiphany in Winchester, where she served as Director of Christian Formation, Becky sensed God's call to ministry elsewhere. A phone call came from David Killian, who invited her to take a closer look at the position at All Saints Parish. She met with a very enthusiastic ASP Search Committee, and the rest is history.

Ideas about connection and balance continued to come up during our conversation. Becky explained that growing into a Christian identity happens not only in the Sunday School classroom. It happens when an adult is greeted by name and feels genuinely welcomed when walking into the Guild Room. It happens when a small child—messy with strawberry jam from breakfast—is included in activities and understands that respect and love for one another is an essential part of a church community. Creating these connections - this reaching out to all ages - is at the heart of Becky's educational ministry.

I hope that in the near future all members of ASP will be able to sit down with Becky, whether one on one or in small groups, to visit and talk about God in our lives. Thank you, Becky, for answering the call to come to ASP, and welcome!

## Rite 13 Ceremony to Take Place on January 21

At the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, January 21, the parish will celebrate as Elizabeth Besancon, Grace Foxworthy, Tom Schnoor, and Marie Wheeler begin their journey from childhood to adulthood. Each of these 7th graders is an active participant in the Journey to Adulthood program, a six-year program of spiritual formation for young people developed by the Episcopal Church. At All Saints Parish, the Journey to Adulthood program has been in place since 2002. It is based on two guiding principles: that manhood and womanhood are free gifts from God, but adulthood is something that must be earned. Participants in the program learn the importance of caring for their bodies, celebrating the gift of sexuality, and using the creative energy that comes from being a man or a woman to become co-creators with God. They also learn that becoming a healthy, well-functioning adult requires certain skills: listening, assertion, negotiation, research and information management, partnership, and leadership. The community of faith provides a safe place in which to learn and practice these skills and to find support as one matures physically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually. Please plan to be at the church on January 21 to celebrate this important day!

## Youth Planning Trip to Nicaragua

The high school young people in our parish are planning a mission trip to Quezalguaque, Nicaragua, in June. Quezalguaque, Brookline's "sister city," is 70 miles north of the national capital, Managua. The youth and adults who are going on this week-long trip will live in the homes of town residents, attend classes at the local high school, and install an outdoor park behind the new library in town. A few fund-raising events are planned at the parish to help to defray the cost of the trip. Please watch for these events and support our missionaries as you are able.

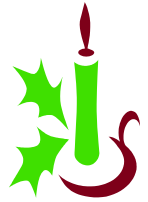
