From the Rector

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners,

I write to tell you that I plan to retire as Rector of All Saints Parish, effective August 16, 2012, my birthday, when I will reach the mandatory date of retirement for clergy in the Episcopal Church.

When I retire I will have served twenty and a half years as your Rector, the second-longest tenure of the nine Rectors of All Saints, exceeded only by the founding Rector, the Rev. Daniel Dulany Addison (1894-1919). On May 1, 2012, I will celebrate my forty-fifth anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. These have been wonderful years and I am grateful to God for the call and opportunity to serve in the Lord's vineyard.

My two decades at All Saints have been among my happiest and most fulfilling years in ministry—professionally, personally, and pastorally. When I came to All Saints in January of 1992, the parish was recovering from an unhappy ending of the previous Rector's tenure. The parish longed for healing of relationships, rebuilding of trust, and reinvigoration of the congregation that had shrunk in size. A dedicated remnant of lay leaders held the parish together with the guidance of the interim Rector, the Rev. J. John Keggi.

The past twenty years have been a time of restoring trust and focusing on the three goals of *Sharing*, *Spirituality*, and *Stewardship*. *Sharing* refers to our efforts to strengthen the mission and outreach of our parish and to create a welcoming spirit to share the good news of our faith with others. *Spirituality* is expressed in our vital worship, enhanced by the beautiful music of our adult and children's choirs, and our programs of meditation, prayer and education for all ages. *Stewardship* includes our care of the buildings and environment as well as our commitment of time, talent and treasure.

My service has been characterized by a deep sense of collaborative ministry of clergy and laity. As a priest my goal is to enable and support the baptismal priestly ministry of the entire congregation. My great joy is to see lay leaders taking responsibility for ministry. The strong lay leadership in our parish can give us confidence that the parish will continue to prosper during the coming months of transition and after my departure. The parish is in good hands with the excellent leadership of our Staff, Wardens, and Vestry. The Warden's letter on page 3 tells how the parish will proceed in the coming months.

We have begun this fall season with great vitality and enthusiasm. I expect that this wonderful spirit of shared ministry will continue strongly until my last Holy Eucharist with you on Sunday, June 10, when I leave for an end-of-term sabbatical. I look forward to our time together in the coming months. I am grateful for your love, friendship, and support.

Letter from the Wardens

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

All Saints Parish has been blessed by the leadership of the Rev. David Killian for 20 years. As you can see from the letter on page 2, David has informed us that he will reach the church's mandatory retirement age next year. Sad as this news makes us, the Episcopal Church policy on retirement is immutable. Looking for the positive in this situation, All Saints now has both the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the fruits of David's long tenure, and also a definite time frame for us to plan for the future.

The new program year has been busy. In September, Emily Howe, our new Schola Director, took up the musical leadership of our children with great verve. The Rev. Julia Dunbar, who was sponsored by our parish for ordination, rejoined our worship as a non-stipendiary priest associate. The visit to our parish of Fr. Joel Makame from Tanzania, a friend to All Saints from our mission activity there, was like a family reunion with a distant relative. The Canon Charles LaFond of the Diocese of New Hampshire, invited by the Stewardship Committee for a workshop and to preach at weekend services, brought us rich food for thought on the matter of stewardship and our relationship with God, which he delivered with uncanny humor and colorful metaphor. Committee meetings, movie nights, Bistro meals are underway.

This year will be filled with much activity and joyful noise as we continue our efforts to build the Blessed Community. Yet, as the nature of a transition is that it "takes time," we are grateful that we will have the time along the way this year to reflect with David on the ways in which our parish has grown and changed since he arrived.

Regarding the upcoming clergy transition, the Diocese provides much guidance and support and is well aware of David's plan. At our November meeting, the All Saints Parish Vestry will be visited by the diocesan officer on transitions and clergy deployment. Generally after the departure of a rector, the parish goes through an interim period of discernment before calling a new rector. As the process for All Saints Parish becomes clearer, we will communicate developments to you.

On All Saints Day this year we are celebrating our parish's 117th anniversary. Thanks to God who has "knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord." Among the saints at All Saints Parish, past and present, this year we give thanks especially for David Killian.

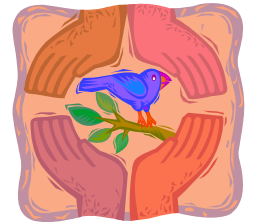

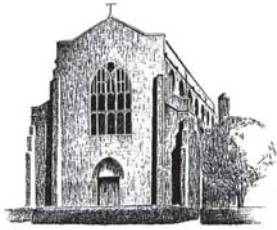
